The Borough of Neptune City was incorporated on October 4, 1881, based on a referendum held on March 19, 1881. The boundaries included all of present-day Neptune City, along with what is now Avon-by-the-Sea and the southern portion of Bradley Beach. The Borough was named for Neptune, the Roman water deity, and its location on the Atlantic Ocean.

The earliest Borough hall was constructed in 1902 at the northwest corner of Evergreen Avenue and Railroad Avenue (now Memorial Drive). Thus contributing to the present-day Borough Hall Located on W Sylvania Avenue, officially opened on July 14, 1973.

The new building included a library, public works garage, police headquarters, courtroom, council chambers, municipal clerk's office, inspectors' offices, and several conference rooms. All to administer and further fulfill the necessities of Neptune City.



Tax and Sewer Utility Billing and Collection

Tax and Sewer bills are due in four quarterly payments on the following dates:

February 1st • May 1st • August 1st • November 1st

Each quarterly payment has a ten-day grace period that includes the due date. Interest is calculated at 8% for balances up to \$1500.00 and 18% for delinquencies over \$1500.00. Please call the tax office if your payment is overdue, interest accrues daily.

You may make your payment in person, online, or by mail. When mailing your payments, please enclose your entire bill and enclose a self-addressed stamped envelope. Application forms for all of the following deductions are available in the Tax Office.

Senior Citizen Deduction

There is a Senior Citizen deduction of \$250.00 for property owners over sixty-five (65) years of age. Your income may not exceed \$10,000, but Social Security, certain government pensions and Railroad Retirement are excluded from this figure. Income verification is required annually for the preceding year, and proof of age are required.

Disabled Persons Deduction

Disabled Persons may be eligible for a \$250.00 deduction. Permanently Disabled Individuals must provide proof of their disability. Income may not exceed \$10,000 a year, but Social Security, certain government pensions and Railroad Retirement are excluded from this figure. Income verification for the previous year is required annually.

Veteran Deduction

Veterans or their surviving spouse are eligible for a \$250.00 deduction. Veterans must meet the following requirement as of October 1st of the pretax year. Veterans must be honorably discharged with an active duty service in the US Armed Forces. A copy of your DD214 is required. You must own or partly own the property that the deduction is claimed for and you must be a resident of the State of New Jersey.

Surviving spouses must be a resident of New Jersey and have not remarried, have proof that the deceased veteran was a resident of New Jersey at the time of their death and own the property that the deduction is claimed for.

Neptune City Recycles



In New Jersey, all residents and businesses are required to recycle by law.

These recycling rules can be found on the Borough website or on the annual calendar.

RECYCLING UPDATE: Co-mingled recycling markets only accept materials that meet their requirements. The list of acceptable items appears below:

All Recycling, paper, glass, plastic bottles, and cans can be mixed and put out together on your scheduled pick up day.

Example: ALUMINUM, GLASS, PLASTIC, STEEL, TIN

All of the following items may be commingled and must be rinsed clean. **NO PLATEGLASS OR DISHWARE.** Plastic should be #1 & #2 pourable bottles only. Cannot exceed five 6-gallon containers or one 30-gallon container.

NEWSPAPER - should be mixed in recycling buckets with other recyclable items.

CARDBOARD - should be flattened to 2'x2' sections and should be mixed in recycling buckets with other recyclable items.

MIXED PAPER - mixed Paper includes: Chipboards, cereal boxes, cake mix boxes, cracker and cookie boxes, etc.

PAPER - letterhead, colored and white paper, junk mail, shredded paper.

BOOKS - soft cover, hard cover with binding and covers removed, phonebooks.

Recycling bins can be purchased at the Borough Office for \$10.00 each.

What are the benefits of reducing waste & recycling?

- Waste disposal costs money. Your local community pays about \$75 per ton of general trash to dispose of this waste at a landfill or incinerator. You are paying for this waste disposal through your local taxes or through trash haulage fees.
- By reducing the amount of waste you generate or sending materials for recycling you not only reduce the waste disposal costs for your community but your local town profits from the sale of these materials to recycling companies. The more you recycle the more money a community can make from the recycling collection and consequently the more money the town has to spend on local schools and other services.
- Recycling helps conserve valuable resources and energy.
- Recycling helps to protect the environment.

Previously published recycling rules are being clarified as to what items can be recycled, and as to how recyclables should be put at the curb for collection. This step is required because contaminated recyclables are rejected by designated disposal markets. The contracted hauler is not authorized to collect any contaminated recyclables.

Recyclables will not be picked up from curbside if they contain non-recyclable items, or if they are placed at the curb in plastic bags.

LEAVES

Leaves may be placed at the curb for collection as follows:

April 1 — May 31

September 15 — December 15

Leaves will **ONLY** be collected during these periods of the year. **Do not bag your leaves** or mix sticks, tree branches, grass or other debris in with leaves. **Leaves in open containers or clear plastic bags will not be accepted.** Please place leaves loose at curb line of the street leaving room for storm water runoff. Do not use lawnmower bags to collect leaves in case of accumulation of grass clippings.

GRASS CLIPPINGS: Grass clippings have been banned from the County Landfill. The Borough of Neptune City will not collect them.

BOROUGH CLEAN UP WEEKS:

BRUSH DROP OFF: Brush and yard debris will not be picked up during the months of December, January, or February with the exception of Christmas trees. **You may drop brush off at the Public Works Building on:**

January 6th & February 10th from 8am—10am

BRUSH & YARD DEBRIS: March—November. Must be neatly stacked and cut into length not exceeding 6 feet or yard debris containers can be purchased at Borough Hall for a cost of \$15. Christmas trees may be placed to the curb on Mondays during the months of December, January, and February.

BULK PICKUP: On your second pickup of the week, you are allowed up 3 additional bulk items (couch, mattress, etc.). Rugs must be cut, rolled, and tied up in bundles not to exceed 30 lbs. each. **Mattresses and box springs must be in plastic.** The following are not included in bulk pick-up:

Brush, leaves, concrete, asphalt, scrap metal, white goods (appliances), paint, oil, antifreeze, all liquid substances, wood scraps, glass containers, aluminum cans, newspapers, cardboard, mixed paper, batteries, light iron, heavy iron, & tires.

WOOD SCRAPS — Not to exceed a 3' x 3' x 3' pile. No major debris will be collected.

PALLETS — Must be broken up, cannot be thrown out whole.

CONCRETE — Must be broken up, into pieces that are no more than 50lbs and a pile that is no more than 3' x 3' x 3'. No major renovation debris will be collected.

ELECTRONICS — Computers, monitors, related electronic hardware, as well as analog or digital televisions without wooded cabinets.

SCRAP METAL — Neatly stacked and cut into lengths not exceeding 6' and or 50lbs.

APPLIANCES — You must obtain a sticker from the Borough Administrative Office at \$15.00 per unit for the following items:

Washers, dryers, refrigerators, air conditioners, hot water heaters, stoves, dishwashers, freezers, dehumidifiers, and anything containing Freon. Pursuant to State Law, doors must be removed from appliances.

OIL TANKS — Must be inspected by a Borough Official. They must be thoroughly cleaned and cut in half and valve removed.

PROPANE & BBQ GRILL TANKS — Contact Monmouth Hazardous Household Waste Facility at 732-683-8686.

POLES — Must have concrete removed from them, including plastic swings and parts.

LAWN MOWERS & OTHER POWER EQUIPMENT — Oil and gasoline must be removed.

TIRES — (3) Tires off the rim can be put out by 6:30am on Mondays or can be disposed of by calling Monmouth County Reclamation Center at 732-683-8686.

PAINT CANS — Latex paint cans can be dried and placed in the garbage.

REMINDERS

***Do not put food waste, oils, or grease down your drains.**

***Do not place debris withing 10 feet of any catch basin or storm drain**

***All Materials must be separated into different piles.**

Neptune City Board of Recreation

The Board of Recreation serves the communities program needs by offering both passive and active leisure activities throughout the four-season calendar year. Program opportunities exist for residents and youth of all ages. The board's goals are to deliver cultural, environmental, social, physical, and educational programs and to ensure that these quality activities are offered in a safe and enjoyable atmosphere. Corresponding fees and charges that support these activities are fixed at levels that provide access to residents from all socio-economic backgrounds, while provisions for scholarships are addressed on a case-by-case basis.

The Board of Recreation consists of nine members appointed by the Mayor. The board designates a Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. They meet at 7:00 pm on the third Tuesday of each month at the Community Center. Each member is a resident of Neptune City and serves without compensation.

Activities and programs provided by the Board of Recreation include Bocce, Basketball (grades 1-8), special needs recreation, adult programs, children's programs, teen programs, T-Ball, summer concerts, movies in the park and bus trips. The programs and activities are at one of our four parks in town or at the Community Center.

Community Center

The Neptune City Community Center is located across from Stop & Shop. It has very affordable registration fees for seniors, children and adults. Some features include a full gymnasium, game room, TV lounge, computer room, fitness room, and multi-purpose room.

CERTIFICATE OF INSPECTION

Applicants need to obtain a **CERTIFICATE OF INSPECTION** for a residential or commercial property sale, rental, or transfer of title for occupancy.

MINIMUM 5 BUSINESS DAYS NOTICE REQUIRED FOR INSPECTIONS

- ⇒ The date and time must be approved by the Inspecting official.
- ⇒ Please provide a phone number where you can be reached for the date & time confirmation by the official.
- ⇒ A \$60.00 **NON-REFUNDABLE** fee must be paid at the time of application (made out to the Borough). A \$35.00 fee will be charged for each inspection thereafter.
- ⇒ Failure to make application for an inspection and obtain a Certificate of Inspection for each new tenant or buyer of a business/dwelling is punishable by a fine in the amount not exceeding \$2000.00.
- ⇒ For rentals, a Megan's Law Statement must be file, as well as a certificate of insurance.

Construction Department

If you are planning an improvement to your property you must obtain the necessary building permits. Local ordinances must be adhered to before a permit can be processed through the Building Department. The Building Department uses state and national regulations as guidelines for actual construction/alteration work. All work must be Inspected to assure that it is performed according to code.

NJ State Uniform Construction Code 5:23-2.14 states: It shall be unlawful to construct, enlarge, repair, renovate, alter, reconstruct or demolish a structure, or change the use of a building or structure, or portion thereof, or to install or alter any equipment for which provision is made or the installation of which is regulated by this chapter, or to undertake a project involving lead abatement in accordance with NJCC 5:17, without first filing an application with the Construction Official, or the appropriate Sub-code Official where the construction involves only one sub-code, in writing and obtaining the required permit therefore.

Please check with the Building Department to see if permits are required. Some projects require a combination of permits.

The following is a partial list of improvements for which permits are required:

Building permits are required for most improvement projects including additions, alterations, renovations, demolition, asbestos removal, tank removal, decks, sheds, fireplaces, wood/coal burning stoves and chimneys, signs, above ground and in-ground swimming pools, pool fences, cabanas and gazebos.

NOTE: A building permit will not be issued until **ALL ZONING** or other prior approvals have been obtained.

- All properties and structures shall meet the most recent Property Maintenance Code.
- No house/apartment cleanouts are allowed. A resident or home owner must remove at their own expense.

Property Maintenance

CONDITIONS CONSTITUTING A PUBLIC NUISANCE:

Conditions constituting a public nuisance include any of the following:

- A. Any physical condition or occupancy of any premises or its appurtenances considered an attractive nuisance to children, including but not limited to, abandoned wells, shafts, basements, excavations and unsafe fences or structures
- B. Any premises that has unsanitary sewerage or plumbing facilities;
- C. Any premises designated as unsafe for human habitation;
- D. Any premises that is manifestly capable of being a fire hazard, or is manifestly unsafe or unsecure so as to endanger life, limb or property;
- E. Any premises from which the plumbing, heating or facilities required by this Code have been removed, or from which utilities have been disconnected, destroyed, removed or rendered ineffective, or the required precautions against trespassers have not been provided;
- F. Any premises that is unsanitary, or that is littered with rubbish or garbage, or that has an uncontrolled growth of weeds; or
- G. Any structure that is in a state of dilapidation, deterioration or decay; faulty construction; overcrowded; open, vacant or abandoned; damaged by fire to the extent so as not to provide

Certified Copies

The fee for all certified copies is \$15.00 payable by cash, check or money order. Valid government issued identification is required. You must fully complete an application for a certified copy, and provide proof of your relationship to the individual named on the vital record you are requesting.

Marriage License Application

At least one member of the couple must live in Neptune City, New Jersey to apply for the marriage license here; unless both applicants are from out of State and are getting married in Neptune City.

Appointments are **required** for marriage license applications. Please call 732-776-7224 x 10 or 45 to set up an appointment. Both members of the couple and one **(1)** witness over the age of 18 must attend the appointment. All three must have valid, government issued identification, and proof that one member of the couple lives in Neptune City. The fee is \$28 payable by cash, check or money order.

Once the application is received by the Borough, there is a mandatory **72 hours waiting period** before the license can be issued. Please note that once the license is issued, it will only be valid for **30 days**.

After your ceremony, you will file your license in the town where the marriage took place; you will also apply for your **certified copy** of your

Licensing Your Dog: All dogs seven months or older must be licensed.

Proof of Rabies Inoculation is required.

Rabies Vaccination Requirement: N.J.S.A. 4:19-15-3a requires that the duration of the immunity extends through out at least the first 10 months of the 12 month licensing period. There is an additional charge for non-neutered or non-spayed animals (\$3.00 for dogs). Proof of Neutering/Spaying is required. Dog licenses (\$13.00 for neutered \$16.00 for non-neutered) are renewed during the month of January.

Dog License Renewal Late Fee: \$5.00 after January 31st.

A Free Rabies Clinic will be held at the Public Works Building on Flexcraft Drive on March 14, 2023 at 6:00pm.

**Neptune City is served by the Monmouth County Health Department.
They provide a number of Health and Environmental services, including:**

HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE FACILITY: The facility is a safe and efficient system for the management and disposal of hazardous materials. Residents can drop off chemicals such as cleaners, pesticides, oil based paints, motor oil and much more.

AIR AND NOISE CONTROL PROGRAMS: This program routinely conducts site visits at gas stations and dry cleaners to determine compliance with NJDEP regulations. It also responds to citizen complaints of indoor air quality, radon, and odors. They also enforce regulations for bus and truck idling.

ADULT IMMUNIZATION CLINIC: Adult immunizations are available and include vaccines such as influenza, tetanus, pertussis and more. For further information call 732-431-7456, Ext 8513.

LEAD BASE PAINT ABATEMENT: Dwellings are inspected by a licensed Lead Risk Assessor with specialized equipment for children with elevated blood levels.

IMMUNIZATION CLINICS: The childhood immunization clinic provides immunizations to children from birth to 18 years old who do not have Insurance or who are underinsured. For an appointment call 732-431-7456, Ext. 8516

PUBLIC HEALTH NUISANCE COMPLAINTS: They investigate resident complaints about noxious weeds, solid waste, insects, rodents, etc. Call 732-431-7456, option 2.

MOSQUITO CONTROL DIVISION: Provides courtesy inspections of properties for standing water and controls mosquito larvae in this habitat as needed. Conducts community-wide pesticide applications for flying adult mosquitos.

RABIES CONTROL: Member municipalities are provided with free rabies vaccination programs for dogs and cats. Specific dates and locations can be obtained by calling 732-431-7456.

FOOD SURVEILLANCE AND SANITATION: Food establishments must operate in accordance with Chapter 24 of the NJ Sanitary Code. Food establishments are inspected at least once per year. Enforcement action can be taken as necessary to insure compliance.

INFECTIOUS DISEASE CONTROL: Health professionals and community members working together to coordinate efforts to heighten public

HOUSEHOLD GARBAGE COLLECTION

The Borough of Neptune City will provide garbage collection to any residential dwelling or business in the Borough (except shopping centers and apartments with more than 15 units) that meet the following requirements: Do not put items out more than 24 hours before your collection


- ⇒ **Up to 5 containers** (with lids) that do not exceed 50 pounds and/or up to 30 gallons in capacity each per pick up. All materials **must be placed curbside by 6:30 am.**
- ⇒ On your second pickup of the week (Thursday or Friday), you are allowed **up to 3 bulk items** including a couch, mattress, chair, stereo, rug, etc. Rugs must be cut, rolled up and tied in bundles not exceeding 30 lbs. each. All materials **must be placed curbside by 6:30am**, but **no earlier than 24 hours prior to pick up.**

Items **NOT** Acceptable for Garbage Collection:

Brush, cans and bottles, mixed paper, newspaper, asphalt, cardboard, chipboard (cereal boxes, etc.), leaves, appliances, drums, tanks and tires.

Any dwelling or business that generates more garbage than what is stated above must provide for the entire collection and disposal at their own expense.
